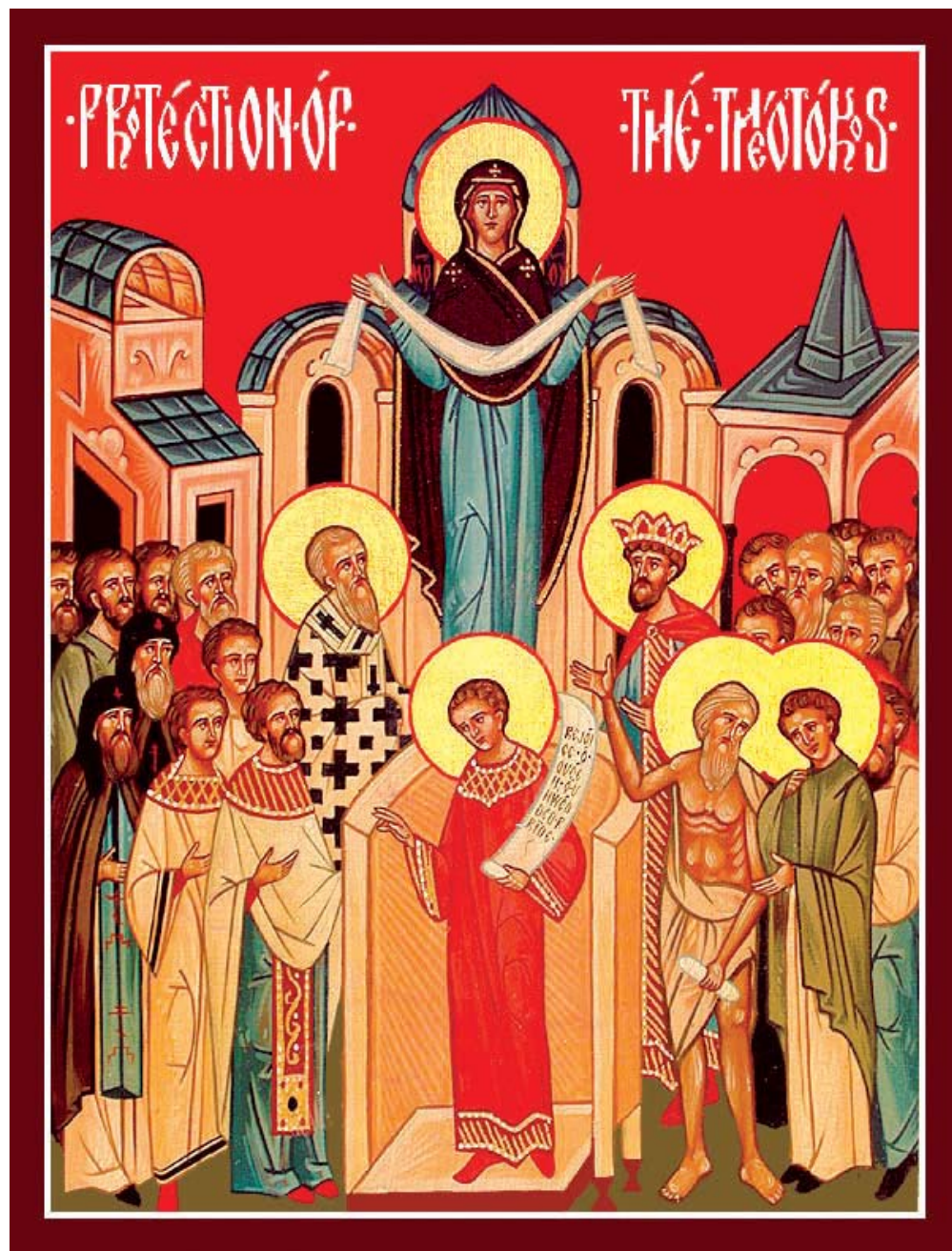

**NEW “DIVINE LITURGY” BOOKS -  
ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS AND DEDICATION**

(The following is a portion of the “Acknowledgements” which is at the beginning of the new Divine Liturgy book:)

*The Divine Liturgy takes us out of time into eternity and in whatever place it occurs, it takes us into the Kingdom of God which is everywhere. However, as it is an experience involving human beings, it takes place in a given location and time. As such this Divine Liturgy book is a product of people who worked in a certain place and time; at Holy Trinity Orthodox Church in Parma, OH, from 1963 to 2019. The first Rector of the parish, Fr. Vladimir Berzonsky, was responsible for setting the liturgical direction of Holy Trinity Church which from the beginning was to be in accessible and understandable English. Over the years several versions of Divine Liturgy books were produced to enhance parishioners’ experience of worship. This edition, done under the direction of the present Rector, Fr. Alexander Garklavs, follows and expands on those previous efforts. The arrangements, preparation and setting for this book were done by Protodeacon Anthony Kall. He and Choir Director Michael Pilat are responsible for liturgical handouts which complement use of this book. The line drawings on the cover and title page were done by Fr. Yves Babich.*

A special acknowledgement is due to Fr. Protodeacon Anthony Kall, who spent many hours and expended much effort in the planning, production and publication of the Divine Liturgy book. Additionally, we must acknowledge that the printing of the book was finally realized because of the generous support of many parishioners over the years.
