COFFEE HOUR:



There are many vegan options and tasty vegan substitutes for dairy and meat that are not hard to find at most grocery stores. On Wednesday we read how Judas betrayed the Savior with a kiss. Thursday's Gospel recounts Jesus being questioned by Pontius Pilate. Friday we read the narrative of Christ's crucifixion and death.
