RETURN OF THE RELICS OF THE APOSTLE BARTHOLOMEW FROM ANASTASIOPOLIS TO LIPARI


The Transfer of the Relics of the Apostle Bartholomew took place at the end of the 6th century. His apostolic activity and martyr's end are remembered by the Church on June 11. The Apostle Bartholomew suffered for Christ in Armenian Albanus (now Baku) in the year 71, where his relics were originally placed. Numerous miracles occurred from his relics, and many of the unbelieving were converted to Christ. Under the emperor Anastasius (491-518), the relics were transferred into the newlyconstructed city of Anastasiopolis and remained there until the end of the 6th century.

When the city was captured by the Persians, Christians took up the chest with the relics of Apostle Bartholomew and fled to the shores of the Black Sea. Pagan priests overtook them and flung the chest into the water; four other chests containing the relics of Martyrs Papian, Lucian, Gregory and Acacius were also thrown into the sea.

The chests miraculously floated upon the waves and reached Italy. The chest with the relics of Apostle Bartholomew came to land at the island of Lipari. The relics of Martyr Papian halted at Sicily, the Martyr Lucian at Messina, Martyr Gregory at Calabria, and Martyr Acacius at Askalon.

The arrival of the relics of the holy Apostle Bartholomew was revealed to Bishop Agathon of the island of Lipari, who went with clergy to the shores of the sea, took the chest from the waters and solemnly transferred it to church.

Myrrh flowed from the relics of the Apostle Bartholomew, healing people of various illnesses. The holy relics remained in the church island of Lipari until the middle of the ninth century when the island was captured by pagans. Christian merchants took up the holy relics of the Apostle Bartholomew and transferred them to the city of Beneventum, near Naples, where they were received with great veneration and placed in the main church of the city.



Proposal

Current Parish By-laws state in Article V, Section 1.a.: "The Parish Council shall be composed of the Rector, ex officio, and twelve (12) elected members."

Proposal to change Article V, Section 1.a., to state "The Parish Council shall be composed of the Rector, ex officio, and <u>seven (7)</u> elected members."

Moving from 12 members to 7 members: Current parish council members will remain for their full term, and will have availability to be reelected for as many terms as the by-laws allow. Reduction to 7 members from 12 will happen by attrition over multiple years until the need for electing council members again arises in order to maintain 7 members.

This Special Meeting is being called before our annual meeting because the outcome of this meeting will determine whether new council members need to be elected at the annual meeting in October.

Notes on proposed change:

- 1. A reduction of council members would:
 - a. offer the potential for active council members to have a more open platform and space to voice their opinions/concerns,
 - b. align more closely with the current membership of our parish,
 - c. increase in the pool of eligible parish members to be elected to the council, and thereby
 - d. allow those parishioners who have served as parish council members increased opportunities to engage in parish life off the council
- 2. Parishioners will still have the ability to attend parish council meetings (as stated in our by-laws Article V, Section 7.g.) and to reach out to the priest and/or parish council members for items that they would like for the council to address.
- 3. In comparison with other OCA parishes, 12 parish council members appears to be higher than most.
 - a. For example, the OCA Diocese of the South (according to their uniform parish by-laws template) recommends 5, 7, or 9 members depending on the size and situation of its parishes.
 - b. Our Archbishop Daniel and our Vice Chancellor, Fr. Esteban Vasquez, have noted that our parish requirement of 12 council members is high and they support a reduction in number.
