

THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST The Meeting of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ in the Temple Sunday of Zacchaeus

Hail, Virgin Theotokos, full of grace, for from you has shone forth the Sun of Righteousness, Christ our God, giving light to those in darkness. Be glad, O righteous Elder, for you received in your arms the Redeemer of our souls. Who bestows upon us resurrection.

Troparion, Tone I,

The Meeting of our Lord is described in the third Gospel. Forty days after His birth, the Divine Child was brought to the Temple at Jerusalem to be presented to the Lord. According to the Law of Moses (Lev. 12:2-8), a woman who gave birth to a male child was forbidden to enter the Temple for 40 days. At the end of the time of her purification, the mother went to the Temple with the child, to offer a young lamb, two turtledoves, or pigeons to the Lord as a sacrifice. The Most Holy Virgin had no need of purification, since she had given birth to the Source of purity and sanctity. Out of humility, however, she fulfilled the requirements of the Law.

At this time the righteous Elder Simeon was living in Jerusalem. It had been revealed to him that he would not die until he beheld the promised Messiah. By divine inspiration, St. Simeon went to the Temple at the very moment when the Most Holy Theotokos and Saint Joseph had brought the Child Jesus to fulfill the Law.
